Your Legal Obligations

- You must report to work as scheduled — your collective agreement is still in effect.
 - If delayed or feeling unsafe at a picket line:
 1. Call your manager immediately
 2. Explain the delay or safety concern
 3. Document time, location, and what happened
 4. Notify your District Chair
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What to Expect

- Picket lines may be at employee parking, terminal entrances, or airport roads.
 - Expect delays — sometimes 1 car every 5 minutes allowed in.
 - Marching, chanting, signs, leaflets, and media presence are normal.
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Safety Tips

- Stay calm, drive slowly, keep hands visible
 - Avoid arguments — don't engage in heated discussions
 - Roll window down slightly if you choose, but not required to take leaflets
 - Offer encouragement if comfortable
 - If intimidated or blocked, call your manager
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Planning Ahead

- Allow extra time for your commute
 - Operations may be busier even before strike day
 - Take breaks and look out for one another
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Solidarity Actions (on your own time)

- Walk the picket line when not scheduled to work
 - Share positive messages of support online
 - Do not wear employer-issued uniforms when supporting
